### REDtone to develop Internet-of-Things (“IoT”) solutions for durian farming with Bangi Farm Resort

**BANGI, Selangor (4<sup>th</sup> August 2018):** REDtone IoT Sdn Bhd (“**RISB**”), a wholly owned subsidiary of REDtone International Berhad (“**REDtone**”), had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (“**MoU**”) with Bangi Farm Resort Sdn Bhd (“**BFR**”) to jointly explore the development of smart farming solutions in a bid to increase the quality and production of durians in Malaysia.

Leveraging on REDtone Group’s strength in integrated network with multiple last-mile technologies, mobility infrastructure, cloud and various analytics platform, the IoT-based farming solution is expected to improve the quality as well as increase the production of durians (including the coveted Musang King) to meet the increasing demand from overseas market.

“Malaysia has one of the largest durian farming areas in Southeast Asia. We are confident that farmers who face some of the inevitable challenges in their orchards, and those eager to switch to the more productive and higher quality durian farming, will benefit from our smart IoT solutions.” Mr. Lau added.

BFR Director, Mr Tan, who shares Mr Lau’s vision said, “BFR has always been positioned as a platform and convergence point for many activities. We are in the business of researching, cultivating, farming, planting of aquaponics, fruits trees, vegetables and herbal plants and processing of fruits and other vegetation produce.”

In a recent online article by The Strait Times, Singapore\*, it was reported that the value of durian exports from Malaysia has doubled from US\$8.8 million (RM35.8 million) in 2011 to almost US\$18 million (RM73.1 million) in 2017. The said article further cited that according to the United Nations Commodity Trade data, Malaysia had in 2017, exported more than 19,000 tonnes of durians mostly to Singapore whilst China's imports of durians have tripled to almost 300,000 tonnes over the last decade (2007-2017).

The above findings augurs well for the proposed collaboration between REDtone and BFR.
